4. First-aid measures

6. Accidental release measures

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

Large Spills: Stop the flow of material, if this is without risk. Dike the spilled material, where this is possible. Cover with plastic sheet to prevent spreading. 7. Handling and storage

Precautions for safe handling
