## 4. First-aid measures

Skin contact

Ingestion

Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Oxygen or Inhalation artificial respiration if needed. Call a POISON CENTER or doctor/physician if you feel unwell.

## 6. Accidental release measures

Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

This material is classified as a water pollutant under the Clean Water Act and should be prevented from contaminating soil or from entering sewage and drainage systems which lead to waterways.

Use a non-combustible material like vermiculite, sand or earth to soak up the product and place into a container for later disposal. Following product recovery, flush area with water.

## Handling and storage

#### Precautions for safe handling
